TIME OF USE VS TIERED PRICING

ENERGY CONTRACTS

It is important to completely understand what they are offering before you sign anything. Many energy contracts sound like a great deal but end of costing more money in the end. HOME ASSISTANCE PROGRAM/GREENSAVERS ENERGY ASSESSMENTS AND FREE UPGRADES

They can help with energy-efficient lightbulbs, power bars and new shower head and they might be to offer insulation and new appliances!

WATT METER LOAN PROGRAM

Watt meters are devices that are used to measure how much electricity an appliance uses. You can use it to find out just how much that space heater or fridge is costing you in electricity. Through a Heat Bank Haliburton County initiative with the Haliburton County Public Library, watt meters are available for loan through all library branches in Haliburton County. You just need a library card!

SAVE ON ENERGY: COUPONS, REBATES AND INCENTIVES

ODSP ENERGY CONSERVATION BENEFIT

If you receive ODSP, you might be eligible for up to \$50 for an Energy Conservation Benefit to help purchase energy conservation products. TIP! Complete the Home Assistance/Greensaver Program energy first to get as many free upgrades as possible. Then, get Save-On-Energy coupons for any products not covered and use the \$50 benefit to buy them!

ONTARIO ELECTRICITY SUPPORT PROGRAM (OESP)

The OESP provides a monthly credit on your hydro bill for eligible customers. That's at least \$35 extra in your pocket every month!

KAWARTHA HALIBURTON RENOVATES

ONTARIO ENERGY AND PROPERTY TAX CREDIT (PART OF ONTARIO TRILLIUM BENEFIT)

The Ontario Trillium Benefit is a credit that you apply for with your income tax return. Talk to the person who prepares your taxes.

CLIMATE ACTION INCENTIVE

The Climate Action Incentive is a rebate that you apply for with your income tax return. If you are a resident of Haliburton County, you can also apply for the 10% supplement for residents of rural and remote communities.

GETTING HELP WITH HYDRO EMERGENCIES

Before Hydro One disconnects your power for non-payment of arrears, they must notify you by phone and in writing. If you receive a disconnection notice, contact either Heat Bank (705-306-0565) or Housing Services (1-877-324-9870) immediately. These agencies can place a hold on the disconnection and work with you to access programs to reduce the arrears and/or make repayment more manageable.

LOW-INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LEAP GRANTS) - UP TO \$500

If you are behind on your hydro bill and have a lower income, you might be eligible for a grant of up to \$500. To find out more:
